#### **FORGIVE US, LORD...**

Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times."

- Matthew 18:21-22 NRSV

In one of my previous calls, there was a family that was quite active in the church. I will call them Fred and Ginger. Fred was a Ruling Elder, Ginger was a Deacon, and her son was active in youth activities. It was a second marriage for both.

Fred had been a teacher in the local school system, but had left to farm with another member of our church. It was not a good time to start farming, and Fred and Ginger had to move to another town where they could both find jobs. There was no longer a Presbyterian church in that town, so they joined another church there, and I lost track of them.

A few years later, we heard that Fred was suffering from advanced stage cancer. Some of the church members participated in a fundraising benefit for him, and when he died, several of us attended his funeral. On the following Sunday, I thanked the members of my congregation for the kindness they had shown to Ginger and to his children. After worship was over that day, the organist came into my office as I was taking off my robe. She opened the conversation with, "Am I going to burn in hell because I am glad he is dead?"

I must have had a shocked expression on my face, as she did not wait for an answer, but continued by explaining that Fred had molested several of her children when they were in school, and he was an elementary teacher. This story came to mind now because the front page of the newspaper this morning featured a priest who had also served in that community who has now been accused of molesting a young person. I have worked with this priest; he always seemed like the one you would want to tell if someone were molested.

Jesus seems to make it very clear that we are to forgive, and keep on forgiving. Please note that Jesus never says that our forgiveness means not holding someone accountable for their sin. If we do not forgive, it has more impact on us than it does on the sinner. Not forgiving can consume us; prevent us from living our lives as God intends us to do, in freedom and in joy.

When the sin involves the exploitation of a young person, we can forgive the exploiter for the disease that caused them to act in this manner, but we need to be very sure as the church that it cannot happen again. If your congregation has not yet adopted a Child Protection Policy, I would encourage you to do so.

# HEALTHY BOUNDARY TRAINING





### UNIFIED MISSION: WHAT IS IT AND HOW IS IT USED

Unified Mission Support, also known as Shared or
General Mission Support, is the Presbytery of the Northern
Plains second largest funding source behind Per Capita.
This funding typically comes from congregations whose
session, though its annual budget, make a pledge or send in
undesignated donations. It is used to underwrite the
mission and programs at the presbytery, the synod and
national levels. However, over the past decade support to
the unified mission has decreased.

Each Fall at the Presbytery meeting, there is a vote to set the percentage of the Unified Mission Support that will remain in the presbytery and how much will go to support the work of the synod and the Presbyterian Mission Agency (national level). Currently it is set at 15 % each for



the Presbyterian Mission Agency and Synod of Lakes and Prairies and 70% remains at the Presbytery level. This formula is used unless a session provides their own designations.

In 2016, the Presbytery of the Northern Plains received \$31,727.40 to support mission and programs, which was not enough to cover the total paid out (\$37,461.90). Here are some of the areas which were supported at the Presbytery level:

- 1001 Worshipping Communities Team support leaders interested in establishing new worshipping communities through prayer, education, listening, and innovative shared thinking. It is their hope to share experiences, struggles, successes, and learning with the presbytery so that renewal might grow in many areas of our presbytery, touching numerous communities and congregations.
- **Bdecan Ministry Team** is a broad-based community initiative to empower the Dakota people of the Spirit Lake Nation. We collaborate to develop projects that will aid community members with support services that help them to provide for their material and spiritual needs. The Bdecan Ministry Team works with individuals and families to develop and build on their values to improve quality of life. The Presbytery also fully supports the **Bdecan Food Pantry**.
- Chogoria Partnership Team is intended to provide to both parties a variety of gifts through building a relationship, through exchanging knowledge, through prayer for one another, through sister congregations, and by engaging in joint activities.
- **Presbyterians for Earth Care** is part of a "nationwide network that cares for God's Creation by: Connecting with God and others through biblical and theological reflection, study, and experiencing God in Creation; Equipping members with news and effective tools and resources; and Inspiring members through conferences on timely eco-justice issues and Creation-honoring worship."
- Youth Connections is a team that organizes youth events and supports youth activities (Spring Youth Retreat, Youth Mission Trips, Presbyterian Youth Triennium).
- **Ministry Regions** purpose is to share in community, fellowship, education and encouragement and to unite in mission and ministry in a handier geographical area.
- Annual pledges to Presbyterian Clearwater Forest and the University of Jamestown.

As Helen Keller said, "Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much." Generous gifts of "grab-andgo" food items and fleece blankets/pillows were collected and donated to the Ronald McDonald House Charities in Fargo, ND to assist those families who are away from home due to a child's hospitalization.

On April 29, 2017, over 50 women registered at the First Presbyterian Church in Moorhead for PW's Spring Gathering. The day began with worship and communion led by Rev. Cathie Bishop, Community Presbyterian Church, West Fargo. With the message "As God's Chosen Ones," a generous offering of \$662.50 was received and will be divided between the Global Exchange to Indonesia, USA Mission Experience to the Northeast, and the Dakota Fund providing our Native sisters with assistance to attend the Churchwide Gathering.

We welcomed two speakers at our Gathering. Ruling Elder Elona Street-Stewart, Synod Executive, shared with us in the morning about how important PW is to her and to women of all ages for learning and, building up and empowering each other in leadership and service.

In the afternoon, Ruling Elder Sue Medsker-Nedderman of Hastings, Nebraska, spoke on her mission trip to the San Francisco Bay area as part of the USA Mission Experience.

The group's itinerary included, among other stops, visits to non-profits working with sex traffic victims, such as Safe House for former traffic victims, Cameron House saving 1,000 Chinese women from sexual slavery, and Justice Center for counseling and housing.

Rich Swartwood, Director at Clearwater Forest, spoke of the special events and camps at

Clearwater Forest this year. Reminding us that everyone can contribute to Clearwater Forest by sending a child or grandchild to camp with a friend and/or contributing a scholarship so no child is turned away from attending.
